New Village Trustee

On August 1 at the River Grove Village Board Meeting, Chris Lilly was sworn in as Village Trustee to fill the spot occupied by now Police Chief Michael Konwinski. Chris grew up on Finley Avenue with his parents and his sister Marjie. He attended Rhodes Elementary School and Holy Cross High School before going to DePaul University. Chris subsequently went on to earn an M.Ed. in Human Development and Learning through DePaul's partnership with the Chicago Psychoanalytic Institute and a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership from Concordia University.

While working as a janitor at Rhodes, he double-majored in English and Secondary Education, leading him to earn his professional educator's license and first job at Holy Cross before being hired at Leyden High Schools, District 212, as a teacher and coach. After 20 years of teaching/department chair work at the high school level, Chris moved on to teach at Concordia University Chicago where he is currently employed as the Assistant Dean of the College of Business. He is the author of a book on literacy coaching and numerous articles in peer-reviewed educational journals which he has presented at several national and international educational conferences.

Chris started out serving River Grove in the Youth Government program (1984), as a little league and softball umpire (1988-92), then became Recreation Director (2005-6), and most recently served as a River Grove Fire and Police Commissioner (2017-19). He has been a member of the River Grove Lions Club since 2004 and is a lifelong member of St. Cyprian Church. He has also served on the Boards of Education for Rhodes, St. Cyprian, Guerin College Prep, and the Catalyst Schools in Chicago.

Chris and Tina Lilly have been married since 1994 and have raised three children in River Grove: Joe (Program Supervisor for the Park District of Oak Park), Matt (Personal Trainer at Fitness Formula Club, West Loop), and Samantha (Loyola University). His mother, Connie, is retired and still lives in the house on Finley Ave. where she happily counts many neighbors as old friends.

School has started and to insure that our children do not go to school hungry we want all residents to know that our food pantry is open! The River Grove Food Pantry is available to any resident in River Grove who may need some assistance. Two pieces of proof of address are required (license or state ID, lease, current utility bill, etc...). Pantry hours are every Tuesday and Thursday from 9 to 11:30 a.m. except holidays and election day. We are also open every second Saturday of the month from 10 a.m. to noon. Help is provided on a once a month basis. Please share this information with any neighbors, families or seniors. We are happy to provide these services to all. Donations are always welcome and can be dropped off during pantry hours or donations can be left at the village office during regular business hours.

Census 2020 is coming!

In an effort to meet the constitutional and legislative requirements the U.S department of commerce will be preparing for the 2020 decennial census. Census Bureau temporary field staff will be working in neighborhoods across the U.S to update addresses lists and maps using laptop computers. Field staff will be knocking on doors in order to verify addresses and gather information on additional living quarters. Field staff will have ID's, laptops, and clothing bearing the US census logos.
