This year's **NFPA Fire Prevention Week** will be held from Sunday October 8 through Saturday October 14th. The Campaign this year is, **"Cooking safety starts with YOU! Pay attention to fire prevention™,"** and it wants to educate everyone about simple but important actions to keep themselves and those around them safe when cooking.

- **Did you know?** Cooking fires are the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of cooking fires and deaths.
- **What can you do?** If you can, turn off the heat source and then get out. Close the door behind you to help contain the fire. Call 9-11 from outside.

It is important to have a **"kids-free zone"** of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food is prepared.
