THREE NEW POLICE SQUADS

Several weeks ago, the village board approved the purchase of three 2018 Police Interceptor Squad AWD Utility Vehicles. When compared to a police squad car, these three new utility vehicles will provide police officers more versatility when patrolling our community and when responding to emergency calls for service. Each new utility vehicle will be outfitted with a MDT (Mobil Data Terminal - computer), a high-efficiency low profile emergency lighting system, and other pieces of emergency use equipment. Purchasing these modern and efficient vehicles begins the process of addressing the long overdue need of replenishing an overused fleet of police vehicles. We anticipate the new vehicles to be delivered and ready for use in early fall. Mayor Guerin and the village board wish to stress their high level of commitment to providing the best and most efficient public safety services to our residents and our community.

LYNDALE STREET IMPROVEMENTS - LEYDEN TO FIFTH

The project will include the replacement of all new curb and gutter the widening of the pavement by two feet to better accommodate snow removal, new carriage walks entrance walks and driveway and alley aprons, patching of the pavement and then a final overlay with new asphalt.

During construction daytime parking on the street will be prohibited between 7:00 am and 5:00 pm to allow for the construction to be completed. In the evening one side of the street will be left over for parking. The Village will also put in place temporary parking restrictions as it relates to street sweeping on Leyden Avenue and Trumbull Avenue between Belden and Palmer to accommodate vehicles displaced during construction. As parking will be at a premium the village encourages residents to utilize their garages for parking of vehicles. Work began in late August and is expected to be completed at the end of September. As in all construction, you will experience inconvenience. We are hopeful the weather will cooperate. The work is being funded with a combination of Cook County Community Development Block Grant the Village received through its 2017 application and Motor Fuel Tax funds, which are part of the gas tax the State collects and shares with local municipalities.

Lyndale repaving will be underway shortly and residents in that area have received notice of the construction timeline. I understand that the most important street and alley is the one in front of your home, because that is the one you use every day. We will continue to fight for funding until every street and alley is up to the standards Grovers deserve!
